Solemn High Mass on July 4 at Holy Family

Latin Mass Community Moving

Midsummer Celebration — **"He must increase, but I must decrease"**
Wednesday, June 23, the Vigil of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, is a day when Catholics, especially those who work the land, traditionally gathered at sunset (when the feast of the following day actually begins) to celebrate around a bonfire, for which there is a special blessing and traditional hymn to the great saint and precursor of Our Lord. This is also one of the times to burn old worn-out blessed religious articles — rosaries (if the beads are not of metal), scapulars, vestments, etc. Other activities will take place in the context of the celebration. Homemade ice cream will be provided; please bring toppings or other desserts. The gathering will begin at 7 PM, and take place at 5520 West State Route 571, West Milton. Sanctuary/Sacristy

Wash, mend, iron altar cloths.

Wash and iron small altar linens (after priest has performed ritual purifications). About 2 times per month. Wash, mend and iron server cassocks and surplices. 2-3 times per year.

Change votive candles and keep stands and glass clean. Once per week, every Saturday.

Church Proper

Clean 2 restrooms, wash floors, sinks, toilets, mirrors and lower walls as needed, empty trash cans and restock soap and paper goods. Once per week, every Saturday.

Keep holy water fonts cleaned and filled. Once per week.

Wipe down pews, kneelers, window sills and other surfaces in the church. Once per month.

Clean, vacuum and dust the choir loft. Once per month.

Mop all the floors in the church, vestibules and stairs to choir and church hall at the beginning of the month. Sweep the same areas at the middle of the month. May need to be done more often during the snowy weather.

Wash all the woodwork including the pews, confessionals and doors with Murphy's Oil Soap and wash all the kneelers. 2 times per year.

Replace burned out light bulbs throughout the property, (Church, Hall, Nazareth Center, and Church exterior). In church, this involves climbing a ladder to the attic to change the lights in the ceiling. Also, ordering and keeping a stock of all the various light bulbs needed throughout the property.

Parish Hall (Undercroft)

Wipe tables, chairs, sweep floors, clean up kitchen and take trash bags to the dumpster. After every coffee and donuts and other church hall socials.

Mop floors in the Hall, kitchen, hallway and conference room and dust conference room. Once per month.

Spring clean entire Hall, kitchen, stage, storage areas and conference room. Once per year. (Group Effort).

Someone to keep an inventory of all supplies needed for Parish Hall activities, (paper goods, condiments, cutlery, etc), paper and soap for restrooms, sacristy and rectory and cleaning supplies and vacuum sweeper bags. Purchasing all of the above as needed. (Will obviously be reimbursed)

Nazareth Center

Mop floors, general cleaning of all areas, empty trash. 4 times per year or as needed.

Spring cleaning of the entire building. Once per year. (Group effort).

Rectory

Wash rectory windows. 2 times per year.

Clean out rectory gutters. 2 times per year.

Power wash rectory garage floor. Once per year after Winter.

Spring clean entire rectory once per year. (Group effort).

(Those living in the rectory will take responsibility for the living spaces)

Exterior Work

Cut grass, blow clippings and dirt off the sidewalks and church steps; pick up litter around the property. Once per week. (seasonal)

Maintain shrubbery, gardens, plant flowers and water these areas. Rake leaves if needed. (Through the seasons as needed)

Apply Scott's lawn products to the grass. 2-3 times per year.

General caulking to various areas and patching of concrete wherever necessary. As needed.

Someone to act as a security guard in the parking lot for occasional evening services after dark.
