### DONATIONS

Henceforth, please make your donations payable to Holy Family Church. Such donations are tax-deductible to the extent the law allows.

### REGISTRATION

Currently none of the faithful lives within the territory of Holy Family. If anyone wishes to become a parishioner, the pastor must agree to this. The pastor does not take this lightly due to the serious canonical obligations involved. If you were a member of the old Latin Mass Community, since all your personal data is on file, you need only ask the pastor for membership verbally. However, membership in the old community does not automatically entitle one to membership in the parish. All others must submit registrations anew, even lifetime members of the "old" Holy Family, since all your information has been taken over by St. Mary Church. The pastor will make it known to you explicitly, either by word or by publication in this bulletin, that your membership was accepted. At that point, you may notify your previous pastor that you have changed parishes. There are very few reasons someone might not be accepted as a parishioner, and these will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Registration forms are available at the doors of the church. Please do NOT neglect to register if you wish to be under the pastoral care of this parish.

About 15 families have had their registrations accepted verbally. We also welcome the Terrell and Reed families to the parish.

### SERVING MASS

All boys or men (ages 11 to 100) are invited to join Mr. White in the sacristy beginning next Sunday at 10 AM for instruction on how to serve Mass. We will alternate, having sessions after High Mass on first and third Sundays, and after Low Mass on second and fourth Sundays. The instruction will include both the ceremonies of serving Low Mass and the Latin responses. Advanced age should not be a deterrent. It is very puzzling that so many teenagers and grown men, many of whom have attended the traditional Mass for the better part of their lives, are unable to serve Mass when it is necessary in an emergency. In a parish church such a situation is embarrassing and will be remedied.

## TOTAL CONSECRATION TO OUR LADY

Anyone interested in making or renewing the total consecration to our Lady according to the method of St. Louis-Marie Grignion de Montfort is advised that in order to make the consecration on August 15, the feast of the Assumption, the preparatory period of 12 days begins this Tuesday, July 13. If you are renewing, you should begin with week one on Sunday, July 25. The pastor has copies of the Total Consecration available in the sacristy and will take part in the prayers at the opening of each of the three weeks with those who are making or renewing their consecration. This is a great opportunity to become closer to our Blessed Mother and therefore to her Son, Christ our Lord.

## LATIN AND CHANT FOR BEGINNERS

The pastor will be conducting a very basic introduction to Gregorian chant, including Latin pronunciation, in the Nazareth Center on the second and fourth Sundays of each month after the High Mass. We will start very simply with the most basic sung responses and prayers at Mass, and then look at some simple Gregorian hymns and Marian antiphons. It will be fun. You do not need to bring anything.
