DONATION SUMMARIES for 2010 for the old community (a different legal entity than the new parish) are available in the back of church. They are in alphabetical order. Please check to see if you have one waiting for you, and hold on to it until next year, when you will need it for your taxes.

REGISTRATION

The parish currently seems to have 45 registered families, a good deal fewer than the Latin Mass Community had. This is obviously incorrect. Remember, membership in the old community does not automatically entitle one to membership in the parish, and a request must be made **either in writing or verbally**. It does not matter if you've been going to the Latin Mass at Holy Family since it began, etc., etc. Please do NOT neglect to register if you wish to be under the pastoral care of this parish.

This week we welcome the Hausmann and Mohs families, Robert Snider, Richard Brodnick, and Daniel Miller to the parish, in addition to those whose registrations were accepted verbally and need no additional mention.

SERVING MASS (UPDATE — NOTE NEW TIMES)

All boys or men (ages 11 to 100) are invited to join Mr. White in the sacristy for instruction on how to serve Mass. We will alternate, having sessions before High Mass at 9:45 on first and third Sundays, and immediately after Low Mass on second and fourth Sundays. The instruction will include both the ceremonies of serving Low Mass and the Latin responses. Advanced age should not be a deterrent. It is very puzzling that so many teenagers and grown men, many of whom have attended the traditional Mass for the better part of their lives, are unable to serve Mass when it is necessary in an emergency. In a parish church such a situation is embarrassing and will be remedied.

CONFESSIONS

There has been some confusion as to which confessional is being used. It is the one in the back of church, by the vestibule (the one that looks **like it's being used**). Please speak softly, and please use both sides of the confessional, as there is a screen on both sides and this greatly in-
