### SERVING MASS — CLARIFICATION

There has been some confusion about the serving instruction sessions.

The idea behind the schedule was that most people prefer one Mass time over another, and thus a compromise was reached by offering two different training sessions. Thus, those wishing to learn would only be expected to attend two sessions per month, either after the 8 AM or before the 10:30 AM Mass. The same material will be covered at either one.

It appears, as with any exercise of the virtue of religion, that interest in serving is flagging. Please do not allow this to happen. Many souls are likely in hell for sins of acedia (sadness and sloth regarding spiritual things), since once a soul has developed a distaste for spiritual things, it has very little hope for salvation outside of a miracle. It is a great privilege to serve our Lord at the altar, not a burden. It is in the sanctuary that the mysteries of our salvation are being renewed each day. While not all are called to give their entire lives to the service of the altar through ordination, all boys and especially grown men should at least desire to know what to do in case of necessity.

The original announcement: All boys and men (ages 11 and up) are invited to join Mr. White in the basement of church for instruction on how to serve Mass. Younger boys may come if their parents wish. We will alternate, having sessions before High Mass at 9:45 on first and third Sundays, and immediately after Low Mass on second and fourth Sundays. The instruction will include both the ceremonies of serving Low Mass and the Latin responses.

Please keep in mind that even if your intention is only to serve High Mass, you still need to know how to serve Low Mass, because only those able to serve and make the responses at Low Mass will be able to fully understand how to serve at High Mass. Therefore, only those servers who either diligently attend the training sessions twice a month or who have demonstrated to the pastor or his delegate their ability to serve Low Mass (and make all the Latin responses from memory) will be allowed to serve at High Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. This policy will take effect starting in October, even if it means the liturgy will have to be celebrated with less solemnity due to lack of servers.

#### CHURCH REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

We have several major repair projects that must be completed in order to keep the building from falling apart. It is in fairly good shape but that can change if we do not do the following, some of which will be beginning as early as this week:

1. Painting and repairing church window frames to prevent rotting wood and eventual damage to the stained glass: \$21,500
2. Roof repairs on church: \$29,181 (combination of two jobs — the lower level tile roof on the church and flat roof above the sacristy).
3. Roof replacement on the Nazareth Center. Our roofing company says that this will be necessary in about 5 years at a cost of about \$60,000: For this we need to put away about \$12,000 per year for the next 5 years.

We are projecting that our regular Sunday collection will cover our normal operating expenses, with possibly a slight deficit depending on any regular maintenance issues that may arise,

which (as many of you know with your own homes) are quite variable in cost and frequency. Thus, any large repair projects like these must be funded by additional contributions. Especially those who have not or do not have the opportunity to contribute their time or talent to the parish are urged to take this opportunity to donate their treasure to the success of our parish.

If you wish to make contributions to these projects, please place a plain envelope in the collection basket with the name of the project you wish to help complete.

#### REGISTRATION

Please do NOT neglect to register if you wish to be under the pastoral care of this parish, otherwise, you will be referred to your territorial pastor for all sacraments and pastoral care. This is especially important for funerals, since after an individual has died, he or she can no longer register in our parish without divine or angelic intervention. Registration forms can be found at the front and side entrances of the church.
