From the Pastor's desk:

In today's Gospel Our Lord gives us the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. He begins by saying "Two men went up to the temple to pray..." The Pharisee is a man who has studied the sacred scriptures and the law of Moses. He is a man admired for his works and his apparent holiness in the eyes of men. But how does he pray? When we look at his words we find nothing but hypocritical pride. He speaks of all he has done. He attributes none of these to God. He asks nothing of God. He has come only to praise himself, look good before other men and put down the tax collector whom he judges to be a sinner.

The tax collector stands far off but his heart is near to God. He has faith that God will hear his simple and humble prayer: "O God have mercy on me the sinner." As Our Lord makes very clear, it is the tax collector and not the pharisee who leaves the House of God justified.

The question Holy Mother Church directs to each one of us today is "How do I pray?" Do I come to church just to see and be seen by others? Do I actually "pray"? Recall the classic definition of prayer given to us by St. John Damascene: "Prayer is the raising of the heart and mind to God". A good prayer life is an important link to God. We know that in our human relationships if

we go a long time without talking, phoning, writing, e-mailing or texting the other person that relationship will not last very long. The same is true with God. Our prayer life is the very key to our relationship with Our Heavenly Father and therefore our salvation!

The Latin Mass allows a lot of time for the faithful to pray, to lift one's heart and mind to God. It gives time to adore, to ask pardon, to petition for what we need or desire and to give thanks to God especially during the silent Canon of the Mass where the consecration takes place. Do we use this time wisely? Let us ask ourselves "How do I pray?" Does my prayer most resemble the Tax Collector or the Pharisee?

Let us work at building a stronger relationship with Our Heavenly Father. He is ALWAYS available for us. He never stops knocking at the door of our hearts. Let us speak with Him often. Let us learn to pray well. Remember practice makes perfect!

Some suggested pieces or content may not work – we have to research that there is a copyright-free version that can be used – but we welcome your input. In the next edition, we will likely go to a different bind, include the prayers of Mass and additional hymns and may remove some hymns as well. Let us know how we can make the hymnals even better!
