

Resumed Fifth Sunday After Epiphany

Although I cannot explain the spring like weather this past week I can explain why we are offering the Resumed mass of the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany. Due to the fact that Easter is a movable feast (ie not on a specific date like Christmas, Dec25th) the number of Sundays after Epiphany to Septuagesima Sunday and the number of Sundays after Pentecost to Advent are variable depending on when Easter falls each year. If Easter is early there are less Sundays after Epiphany so these Sundays are added between the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost and the 24th (and Last) Sunday after Pentecost. Therefore the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany which was not offered before Septuagesima began will be offered today as will the Sixth Sunday next week. For these Resumed Sundays the Introit, Gradual, Offertory and Communion are taken from the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost but the Collect, Epistle, Gospel and Postcommunion are from the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany. The 24th Sunday After Pentecost is always the last Sunday before Advent due to the nature of its epistle and Gospel regarding the end of time which is indeed suitable for the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. Believe it or not there is method to the madness! As for the Spring like weather, we will just have to thank Our Good, Almighty God for arranging that!

5th Sunday After Epiphany

In today's Gospel, Mt 13:24-30, we read the parable of the Wheat and the Cockle. It reminds us of Satan, his demons and those souls who deny God, refuse His grace and mercy and instead attack the good relentlessly. We ask "why does God allow evil?" and "why does it seem the good suffer while the wicked appear to prosper"? Holy Mother Church teaches us that although God did not create evil, just like the farmer did not sow the cockle (weeds) into his field, He does allow evil to exist but only that a greater good might come from it. God allows the devil, his demons and the wicked to tempt and try the just in many ways but always within the limits set by God. He always gives us all the grace we need to conquer sin IF we choose to use that grace! The wheat in the parable was still able to bear good fruit - and so can we!!!

This account also demonstrates the patience of God. He allows the wheat and the weeds to grow together to test the strength of the wheat but also, unlike nature, He knows some of those weeds can become wheat and bear good fruit! We have the examples of the Good Thief, St. Mary Magdalene and St. Augustine who prove the patience, mercy and grace of God can work miracles!

Yes, the wicked might seem to be triumphing in our world today but the time of the harvest is coming! At the Last Judgement the wheat and the cockle will be separated forever! Where will we end up—in the fire or in the barn where there will be no evil anymore?!

First Friday / First Saturday


