From the Pastor's desk:

Today's Gospel is the Parable of the Unjust Steward. The words that we should focus on are those of our Master: 'Make an accounting of thy stewardship for thou can be steward no longer.' Each one of us **without exception** will make an accounting for our time here on planet earth. Our Creator God has given us first of all a human body with an immortal soul. He has given us life, our metaphysical "being" which according to the Angelic Doctor is a participation in the existence of God. Our Creator has given each of us a certain intellect, certain talents, a certain position within a family and in society in general. Each of us has been given a specific DNA blueprint that is uniquely our own. Yet of all these personal gifts that God has given us the most important was that which we received at baptism—the supernatural gift of sanctifying grace which carries with it the theological virtues of faith, hope and love, the moral virtues of prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance, as well as the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit all of which are given to help us become holy, to help us become supernatural. They are the means by which we can indeed become perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect. This we **MUST** do if we wish to enter into eternal life with Him in heaven. The question today that we need to ponder will be the key question on the day of our particular judgement. **How have we used these gifts God has so generously given us?**

St Augustine while reflecting on the accounting each of us will have to give for all the wonderful graces received exclaimed: "How unhappy am I! What will become of me having received so many graces? I am more afraid on account of these than on account of my many sins although they are numerous!" Remember to those to whom much is given much will be expected.

So today let us **pray and act now** that we prepare for that accounting. The Unjust Steward is commended not for stealing and lying but because he had the foresight to prepare for the inevitable! Let us begin this day to make friends with the heavenly court. As your new pastor my 1st public act will be leading Holy Family Parish in an Act of Consecration

to the Immaculate Heart of Mary invoking her powerful intercession that brought about the very first miracle of her Son. Let us also continue to invoke the aid of all the saints, especially our patrons, and by praying and listening to our guardian angel, another great gift from God that we too often take for granted. Let us also make friends with the Poor Souls in purgatory by praying and sacrificing for those who died with sanctifying grace yet still had debt to pay due to venial sin or to completely repair damage due to sins already confessed. These souls will one day be among the Heavenly Court where they will no doubt intercede for us!

And finally let us also begin today to look for the many opportunities to gain grace by exercising the virtues and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit through performing the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. In doing so we will come closer to accomplishing the mission the Master has placed us on this earth to do. By taking advantage of the many opportunities your Heavenly Father will send you today, by seizing those spiritual riches now, you will be gaining treasures that thief cannot steal nor moth eat and you will prepare for that day of accounting which is always sooner than one thinks! Take advantage of the graces of each day within this Year of Mercy while you can! Prepare to make an accounting of your stewardship!!
