So often we like to see ourselves as the hero of the story, the one who saves the day, but have we not some time in our life been like the Jewish Priest and Levite rationalizing away a work of mercy? Jesus, God Himself came and rescued man kind from eternal death. He didn't think of excuses. He realized the cost yet still cared for us. He cleansed our sins with His wine which symbolized His blood which we offer up today. He set us on His donkey which symbolizes His human nature and took us to the Inn, the Catholic Church and left us in the care of the Innskeeper, the Holy Father, until He comes again.

What gratitude, what love should we have for Our Good Samaritan! Let us heed His words during this year of Mercy. Let us be Good Samaritans too—"GO AND DO LIKEWISE!"
