After all who are better examples of laborers than the members of the Holy Family? St. Joseph, Foster Father of the Child Jesus, is proclaimed by the Holy Catholic Church as the Patron Saint of Laborers whose 1st class feast we celebrate on May 1st each year. In him we see the just man of God, a man of prayer, who became the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary (March 19th feast).
