External Solemnity of the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

Today we celebrate the external solemnity of the Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. An "external solemnity" is when Holy Mother Church allows a major solemn feast to be transferred to a Sunday in order that more of the faithful can participate. The actual feast is this Friday, Oct 7th. This date was chosen because on that day in 1571, the Ottoman Empire was attempting to extend itself into Europe. The Muslim Turks had become THE naval power in the Mediterranean Sea and were threatening all of Christendom, including Rome! Whoever controlled the Sea controlled trade as well. Pope St. Pius V had summoned a Holy League of Christian ships from throughout Europe to push back the Muslim threat. In 1571 Holy Mother Church was still suffering from the so called Protestant "Reformation". The Council of Trent had helped to stop the loss of so many souls. Still today she suffers from that internal wound. In 1571 she was also being attacked from the outside. What pressure must have been put on the Vicar of Christ!

So what did he do? He called on the help of the Holy Mother of God! It was no mere coincidence that the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary just happened to be meeting in Rome. This group was made up of Catholics from around the world who promised to pray at least one five decade

rosary every day. On Oct. 6th the Pope appealed to them and to all Christians to pray the rosary beseeching Our Lady's intercession in the all important battle that was to take place the following day. In response to the Holy Father's call all of Rome seemed to rise up in continuous supplication to the Mother of God by way of huge candle light rosary processions that continued throughout the night as well as small families and individuals praying in the privacy of their own homes. The next day with the beads still passing through the fingers of the faithful the Battle of Lepanto began. The rest is history. The Holy League won such a decisive victory that it marked the end of Turkish naval power in the Mediterranean and proved to Pope St. Pius V and all Christians the immense power of the Holy Rosary.

Today, like the Church in 1571, we see Holy Mother Church and our nation being attacked from within and without. We too like St Pius V find ourselves in great peril especially with the election coming up in just over one month with so much at stake! Let us therefore turn to Our Lady of the Rosary and pray unceasingly for her intercession in the spiritual warfare being waged against our faith and country. Let us turn to the Queen of Heaven!
