Today's Gospel, MT 22:15-21, is the true account of when the Pharisees and Herodians teamed up to try to destroy Jesus' credibility with the Jewish people. They put Him to the test by asking Him if it were lawful to pay the tax. This tax which had been imposed by Rome when Judea was made a Province in 6 AD was resented by all Jews as an affront to their national pride and an insult to God's Chosen People. They believed themselves to be God's subjects and owed allegiance to no pagan power. Unfortunately, as we see throughout the Old Testament, whenever God's Chosen People rejected their God and His commandments they were given weak effeminate rulers whom God permitted to be overcome by pagans as a punishment for not following that very God they claimed was the only authority over them. We in America should certainly learn a lesson from their situation as well!

Jesus' answer to their question is forceful and final. He first asks to see the tribute, the denarius, and He asks "whose image and inscription is on it?" Everyone knew the answer just as much as everyone today knows who's image is on the dollar bill. "Caesar's" they said. Our Lord responded with that important principle we too must follow today "Render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar but render to God what belongs to God." This answer is so profound and so in line with Christ's teaching of the Kingdom of heaven that His adversaries are speechless. Render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar-but no more- because God must certainly be given His due! A spiritual side they did not even consider. Our soul was made in the image and likeness of God. Do we render what belongs to Him?
