### The Feast of Christ the King—Procession & Consecration

According to the Latin Mass calendar now known as the “Extra ordinary Form” today, the last Sunday of October, is the Feast of Christ the King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in an attempt to stem the tide of growing secular humanism that grew out of the so called “enlightenment” of the 18th and 19th centuries which sees man as the center of the universe who creates “god” in his own image and likeness. Secular Humanism is therefore a way of life that leaves God out of man’s thinking and living organizing one’s life as if God did not exist
