

24th/ Last Sunday After Pentecost

Today marks the final Sunday of the Liturgical Year as well as the end of the Year of Mercy. Believe it or not next Sunday will be the First Sunday of Advent which is the beginning of a new liturgical year, a cycle that has continued for almost 2000 yrs! However, it will NOT continue forever. Holy Mother Church reminds us that the world will end one day. Our Lord Jesus will come again, this time not as a little baby in swaddling clothes but as the Just Judge with power and majesty! He will come to judge the living and the dead assigning us our place for ALL ETERNITY!!

However, He does not determine where we will spend eternity—WE DO! By our actions, through our own free will, we make decisions to either follow Christ or separate ourselves from Him. The latter decision places us under the domination of Lucifer, the fallen archangel, by default. If we do not deny ourselves, pick up our cross and follow Jesus we will indeed fall under the power of the Evil One. "You too can be like gods" is that old lie that resulted in mankind's banishment from the Garden of Eden and brought evil, including death, into the world for us. It continues to be whispered into our ears with every temptation. So many see this earth as the place where they will find happiness. Yet the more they try to please themselves the less happy they become.

And so Holy Mother Church presents her children with the truth today—there is a God who will be coming back to judge the living and the dead at the end of the world! The Second Coming of Christ, the End of the World and the Final Judgement are indeed very sobering thoughts. She presents them to us not to terrorize us but rather to motivate us to choose well our final end. She wants us to be faithful to God, to keep the commandments, to frequent the sacraments, those vast reservoirs of sanctifying grace, and to pray daily especially the Holy Rosary, to practice love for God and love of neighbor because of God and to resist temptation to which we are all subject. It is absolutely certain that these three things will happen sooner or later. We must ask ourselves "Am I ready!" "Where would my place be if Jesus came to judge me this very day!"

These truths concern every one of us. Let us therefore pray for the grace to persevere and to live a good and holy life faithful to our Lord and Redeemer who has shown such mercy to us!

HAPPY THANKSGIVING! THURS. NOV. 24TH



The origin of this national holiday actually predates the United States of America. It was celebrated by the pilgrims of the Plymouth Bay Colony under Gov. William Bradford. The previous winter had been extremely harsh in which 46 of the 102 pilgrims had died. With the help and friendship of the Wampanoag Indians, es-

pecially Squanto who taught the pilgrims where to fish, hunt and plant, they survived and even enjoyed a plentiful harvest in the year 1621. The Pilgrims therefore appropriately invited the Native Americans to celebrate a meal with them to thank God for the great harvest and His many blessings. How important for us to celebrate this national holiday and keep the tradition of thanking God for all His benefits! What better way to thank God than to come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at 9AM and participate in the Eucharistic Feast which goes back to the holiest Thanksgiving feast ever, the Last Supper! Recall that the Greek word "Eucharist" actually means "Thanksgiving:" We have so much to be thankful for! Be sure to come to the Eucharistic feast and give thanks to God!
