HAPPY New Year

This week there are three great feasts:

Today—The Octave Day Of Christmas

Formally called the Feast of the Circumcision in the Extraordinary Form it is now known as the Octave of the Nativity for the birth of Christ cannot be celebrated in just one day but is extended to eight. According to the law of Moses it was on the eighth day after birth that the male child was circumcised, a ritual analogous to Baptism whereby he was incorporated into the Jewish religion and therefore part of the covenant with God. He was also given a name at his circumcision.

Jan 2nd—Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

Tomorrow we celebrate this feast which recalls to our mind who this Child is: “Jesus” means “God saves” in Hebrew. We are also reminded by St Paul in Phil. 2:10-11 “At the name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth”. We were taught in elementary school to bow our heads every time we hear that holy name of Jesus. Since it belongs to the Second Person of the Trinity it has great power. Our Lord Himself told us “whatever you ask the Father **IN MY NAME** he will give it to you” Jn 16:23. The Holy Name is powerful for it designates the mystery, the power and the mission of the Son of Man who came to save us. To call upon His Holy Name is to appeal to the infinite merits of His passion, death and resurrection. For this reason the Catholic Church has always preached, blessed, cast out demons and performed miracles through the name of Jesus. Mankind finds in the Holy Name all that it needs and all that it longs for: peace, pardon, love, joy, power over demons, eternal life and God’s great mercy.

Blessed be the Holy Name of Jesus!

Jan 6th—Feast of the Epiphany

This Friday we will offer a high Mass on this feast where the identity of this Child Jesus was manifest to the magi (“Epiphany” means “a manifestation”) **MASS WILL BE AT 7PM.**
