## Fifth Sunday After Epiphany

In the Gospel today (MT 13:24-30) we have the Parable of the Wheat and the Cockle. It reminds us of Satan and his demons relentless attack on us, sowing weeds "while men were asleep". #### **Right to Life News—Cardinal Burke to Speak**

My name is Kim Klapchar, I am a Catholic resident physician at OhioHealth here in Columbus, Ohio. I have organized a medical ethics conference with His Eminence Cardinal Burke on the evening of February 7th, 2017 at The Ohio State University's Medical College from 6PM to 9PM.

Cardinal Burke will be giving the keynote address of the evening, entitled "The Economy of Life". In addition to His Eminence's speech, there will be 3 other very distinguished speakers, including:
