Holy Days of Obligation: Check Announcements

#### Qinquegesima Sunday

Today is the last Sunday before Lent. In the epistle St. Paul exhorts us to practice the greatest of all virtues which is charity. In the Gospel we have the proof of God's charity to us. Jesus tells His apostles that He is going to Jerusalem and that He will be mocked, scourged, spit upon and then they will put Him to death.

Greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends. Jesus knows exactly what is going to happen to Him yet He still goes for love of us.

What will we do for love of Him this Lent? Like the blind man in the Gospel today let us ask—"0 Lord that I may see!" How much we would be willing to sacrifice if we could truly see how much He loves us and sacrificed for us.

#### Ash Wednesday-Obligatory Day of Fast and Abstinence— Mass at 7PM

Lent officially begins THIS WEDNESDAY! Although it is not a holy day whereby we are obligated to attend Mass it is however, an obligatory day of fast and abstinence. ABSTINENCE— means not eating any meat, soups or gravies that are made from the meat of <u>warm blooded animals</u>. (Ash Wednesday and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence under pain of sin!)

LENTEN FAST—generally means only one full meal per day with meat (unless it is a day of abstinence). Two other meatless meals are allowed but the quantity of these two small meals together should not equal the amount taken at one "regular" meal. Snacking between meals is NOT ALLOWED but liquids may be taken, however, the stricter the penance the greater the grace! The laws of fasting are not binding on those with medical conditions that would cause harm to oneself or to an unborn child within the womb.

<u>Stations of the Cross Begin this Friday at 6PM!/First Friday/First Saturday</u>

This Friday is the first Friday of Lent and the <u>First Friday of the month</u>. Stations begin at 6PM, Mass at 6:30. There will be a meatless Soup/Sandwich/Salad Potluck in the parish hall. <u>First Saturday Holy our 8Am with Mass at 9Am</u>.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE. Our annual spring campaign begins today with an opening rally at the Kettering abortion mill at 2 PM. The 40-day period officially starts this Wednesday (Ash Wednesday) and continues through April 9(Palm Sunday). Please consider spending an hour each week in silent, prayerful witness in front of the mill, an ideal sacrifice for Lent. You can sign up for hours online at https://40daysforlife.com/local-campaigns/dayton/ or you can simply come as you have time. Our goal is to have sidewalk coverage 7 AM to 7 PM every day (Sundays 1 PM to 7 PM). The fate of the abortion mill is now in the hands of a Montgomery County Common Pleas Court judge, after its license was revoked last November by the Ohio Department of Health. However, we know that this is a spiritual battle and must be won with spiritual weapons. Please join us for life!
