Sixth Sunday After Pentecost

(Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel)



On July 16th, 1251, exactly 766 years ago today, the Holy Mother of God gave an answer to the many desperate prayers of a Carmelite monk named Simon Stock. He was the Superior General of an Order that was going through a dark crisis that threatened to tear apart its already rapidly weakening ranks. She appeared to him as he knelt in prayer at Aylesford England. Presenting to him the Carmel-

ite Brown Scapular, she made her promise of unparalleled generosity to him, his spiritual children and to all those who wished to consecrate themselves to her by this special sign. She handed him a Brown Scapular while sayings: Receive this Brown Scapular. It is a pledge of salvation and safeguard in danger. "WHOSEVER DIES WEARING THIS SCAPULAR SHALL NOT SUFFER THE ETERNAL FIRE". Soon after, the Brown Scapular helped the Carmelite Order flourish again bringing up such children as St. Teresa of Avilla, St John of the Cross and of course the "Little Flower", St Terese of Lisieux. Through many miracles it has become known as one of the most powerful sacramentals of the Church. The importance of the Brown Scapular is also seen in that one hundred years ago, Oct 13th, 1917, during the Miracle of the Sun at Fatima the Blessed Mother appeared as Our Lady of Mount Carmel. She made a promise to St. Dominic that "one day through the rosary and the brown Scapular I will save the world"
