
# HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC CHURCH

# The Fourteenth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's Gospel, our Lord reminds us that we cannot serve two masters. We cannot serve God and mammon (the pleasures of this earth). Each one of us must make a decision. Do we prefer temporary earthly pleasures that cannot bring us a true and lasting happiness or will we live our lives for the eternal joy of heaven, that which alone can be our true and lasting happiness? Our thoughts, actions and the fruits of those actions which St. Paul mentions in the epistle, reveal which choice we have made. Are we living for Christ or for ourselves? Let us recall that if we live for ourselves we fall by default into the hands of the devil who is much stronger than us. If we turn our backs on an all Good God we will find evil, the absence of good, and be under the devil's dominion. Why would anyone do that? Let us therefore live for God! St Therese, the Little Flower, suffered much but was still joyful because she knew "the earth's my ship, NOT my home" and lived accordingly. Let us serve God as she did so we too may enjoy His face as she does now-forever!

100th Anniversary of Fatima—September 13th! Just a reminder that this Wednesday is the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima appearing to the three children. Despite the ridicule and jokes of the secular, atheistic press, more than 30,000 people gathered in the Cova for the September apparition. Whether drawn by devotion or curiosity, they prayed the rosary while awaiting the arrival of the visionaries and their vision. When at last the time came they could hear Lucia say, "What do you want of me?" Lucia heard the Virgin say "Continue the Rosary, my children. Say it every day that the war may end. In October Our Lord will come, as well as Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Saint Joseph will appear with the Child Jesus to bless the world. Some I will cure, and some I will not. In October I will perform a miracle so that all may believe."

Pope Francis has granted to the faithful a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions on the 13th of each month to all "the pious faithful who visit with devotion a statue of Our Lady of Fatima soloratory or proper place during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, the 13th of each month from May to October (2017), and there devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary. Those seeking an indulgence must also pray an Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima. "We will offer these prayers to Our Lady after the 7:15AM Mass! What a great gift during this jubilee yea!
