Twentieth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's gospel, JN4:45-53, the royal official asks Jesus to come and heal his son who is in danger of death. Our Lord tests his faith by simply saying "Go thy way, thy son lives." The man believed and proved his faith by walking away. His faith is rewarded and his whole family became Christians.

At the seminary in Denton there is a poster of Venerable Fulton Sheen that reads: 'Believe the incredible and you can do the impossible. It is our want of faith that holds us back even as Peter,. Why did he begin to sink? The Gospel gives us the reason. He took account of the winds. He began reading surveys. It was established statistically that 99.44% of mankind cannot walk on water. All the incredulities were in the winds. When he took his eyes off Christ, Peter began to sink."

Faith is a great gift from God, a very powerful gift. We see what happened that first Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Catholic Church, when the twelve apostles inspired by the Holy Ghost first put their faith into action. These were twelve common everyday men, fishermen and tax collectors. None of them would be selected for a presidential cabinet seat yet in just one day, filled with the Holy Ghost, they were able to bring 3,000 people into the Faith through the sacrament of baptism. Today their work, their Faith, has reached all corners of the globe and Holy Mother Church claims 1.2 billion children living today. That's an increase of 100 million!! The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass has been offered on all seven continents!

St Paul describes Faith as "the <u>substance</u> of things hoped for, the <u>evidence</u> of things that appear not" (Heb II:I). This definition clearly describes the essence of the virtue of supernatural faith. It links faith with hope of future things and to certainty concerning supernatural truths. An <u>act</u> of faith, like that of the ruler in today's gospel is a true assent, not merely confidence or hope, but a true consent of the will to believe what God, the Eternal Truth Himself, has revealed to us. What a great and unfathomable gift! Let us pray always for an increase of faith!
