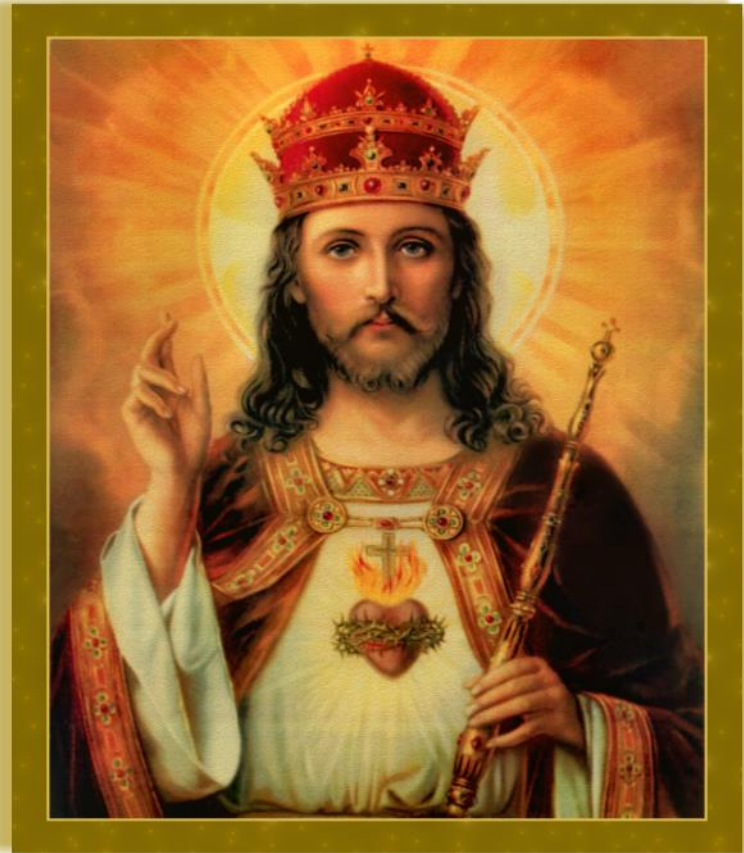

The Feast of Christ the King

According to the Latin Mass calendar now known as the “Extra ordinary Form”, today the last Sunday of October, is the Feast of Christ the King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in an attempt to stem the tide of secular humanism that grew out of the so called “enlightenment” of the 18th and 19th centuries which sees man as the center of the universe who creates “god” in his own image and likeness. Secular Humanism is therefore a way of life that leaves God out of man’s thinking and living, organizing one’s life as if God did not exist. This feast by which we as Catholics proclaim our fidelity and love to such a gracious King is therefore intended to protect us from such heresy which actually dates back to our first parents and that first lie of the ancient serpent to Eve which caused the eviction of mankind from the Garden of Eden “you too shall be like gods”. The Feast of Christ the King is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ’s royalty over individuals, families, societies, governments, nations and the entire universe! He is indeed the Lord of Lords and King of Kings. Yet being Almighty God the human title of “king” is actually a demotion for Him! How much He must love us to accept this earthly title and allow us to be His Holy People and not His slaves as we deserve! Let us therefore show our fidelity. Let us continue to look forward, prepare and pray for that day when “He shall come again to judge the living and the dead and of His kingdom there shall be no end” as we pray in our Creed every Sunday. And so today let us rejoice on this great Feast of Christ reigning in our hearts as King. Pray for our country and for good leaders especially the rosary as Our Lady of Fatima has asked for the past 100 yrs! (A reminder that a plenary indulgence

can be gained for reciting the Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus which we will do after both masses.)
