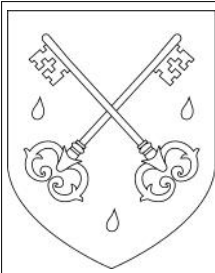

## Sunday Within the Octave of Christmas

**Merry Christmas! Today we continue to celebrate the birth of Our Savior. This event is so great we cannot celebrate it on one day alone but with an octave, eight days to bask in the glory that God has become one of us in order to free us from our sins. "For God so loved the world that He sent His only Begotten Son that whosoever believes shall not perish but have eternal life". (JN 3:16)**

**In the Gospel we have two of the first Christians, Anna and Holy Simeon who have been waiting for the coming of the Messiah, the fulfillment of the promise the Father made after the expulsion of our first parents in punishment for the original sin. He has come to conquer sin and death and reopen the gates to heaven. Anna and Holy Simeon are so filled with the Holy Ghost through their prayer life they recognize who this Baby Jesus truly is. Simeon cries out "Now Thou dost dismiss thy servant O Lord according to Thy word in peace, because my eyes have seen Thy salvation which Thou has prepared before the face of all peoples". His life is fulfilled just holding Jesus in his arms. How much more should we be fulfilled when we receive Him Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist!!**

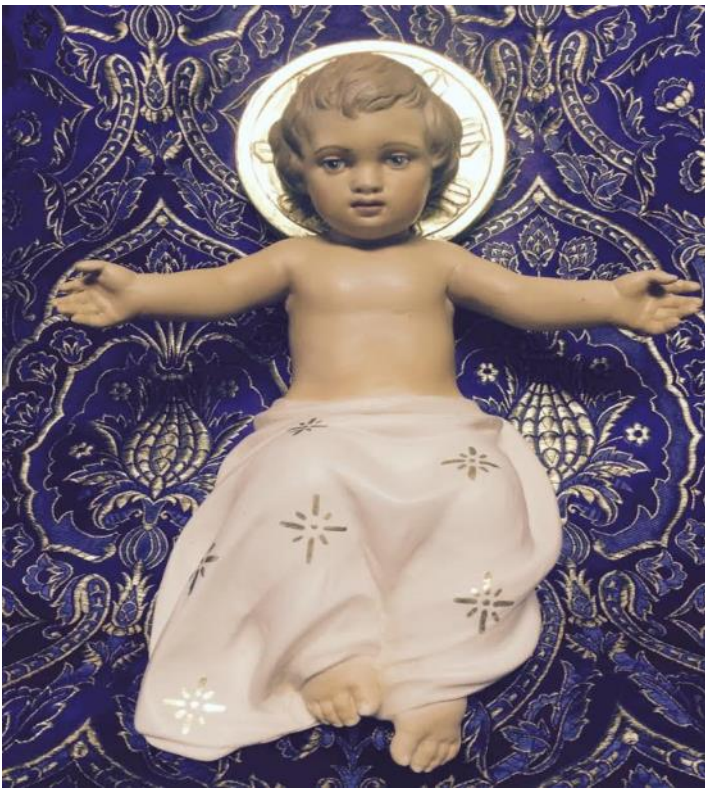
