

<u>The Three Theophanies</u> <u>Adoration of the Magi (Jan 6th)</u> <u>Baptism of Jesus (Jan 13th)</u> <u>Miracle at the Wedding Feast of Cana</u> <u>(Second Sunday After Epiphany)</u>

The Wedding Feast of Cana

In today's Gospel, on this Second Sunday after Epiphany, Holy Mother Church presents to us the third "epiphany" that Greek word which means "a manifestation". The Fathers of the Church go even further by calling the three events "theophanies" "manifestations of God" as they give evidence to us who this Jesus is, a proof of His divinity. The first theophany was the coming of the magi, gentiles bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, significant gifts that show His kingship, His priesthood and the death he will die to redeem mankind.

The second theophany is the Baptism of Jesus which is celebrated on the former octave day of the epiphany, Jan. 13th. Here we read that 30 years after His birth, as Jesus was preparing for His public life, He came to St. John the Baptist and was baptized in the Jordan River where the Holy Ghost came down upon Him in the form of a dove. St. John then testifies "I have seen and born witness that this is the Son of God".

Today we have the third theophany where Jesus performs His first of many miracles at the Wedding Feast of Cana through the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the same time as manifesting His divine supernatural power he also manifests His great love for the institution of marriage.

Let us be sure to remember this occasion, the first miracle of Our Lord, whenever our protestant friends wrongfully say that Mary was "just another woman" or question why we honor her. Remind them whose intercession it was that brought about that first miracle. She merely states "vinum non habent", "they have no wine" and Her Divine Son, flesh of her flesh, turns mere wash water into the best wine man has ever tasted while also foreshadowing the Holy Eucharist where He will turn wine into His blood for us!

Therefore, as we continue to grow in our faith during this time after Epiphany and throughout the new year let our lives be drawn more deeply towards Him, the God man, doing all for His greater glory preparing for His Second coming. Hear His voice within your heart. And also the words of Our Lady, her last recorded words in the Gospel and to us: "Do whatever He tells you!"
