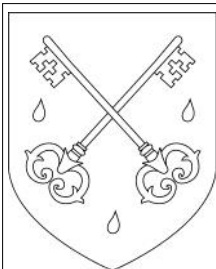

The parable of the Sower and the Seed

It is indeed interesting to note that Our Lord was actually doing what he was speaking about in relating this parable. He was spreading the seed of faith among all those who had come to listen to Him. Remember, God has been sowing since the dawn of time. Starting with Adam and Eve and continuing to this day and will continue until the sound of the trumpet signaling the final gathering of the harvest on the last Day. Since we did not yet receive our CMA envelopes next Sunday will be our Commitment weekend for the 2018 Catholic Ministries Appeal. This annual appeal provides local, Catholic ministries the funds to continue to help people here in our communities. These ministries such as St. Rita's School for the Deaf, Prison Ministry, Hospital, Seminary and Vocation Ministries all depend on our help each year. Thank You!!!) We will have pledge cards available at Mass next Sunday. Holy Family is indeed a part of the Archdiocese with all of its rights and privileges. We especially found this dramatically demonstrated after the vandalism and water damage done to the Nazareth Center. The Archdiocesan insurance will pay all but the deductible for the huge amount of restoration! Please prayerfully consider what you can give to this year's appeal.
