QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

Today is the last Sunday before Lent. In the epistle St. Paul exhorts us to practice the greatest of all virtues which is charity. In the Gospel we have the proof of God's charity to us. Jesus tells His apostles that He is going to Jerusalem and that He will be mocked, scourged, spit upon and then they will put Him to death. He sets His Face towards Calvary! Greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends. Jesus knows exactly what is going to happen to Him yet He still goes for love of us. What will we do for love of Him this Lent? Like the blind man in the Gospel today let us ask—"O Lord that I may see!" How much we would be willing to sacrifice if we could truly see how much He loves us and suffered for us, how terrible our sins are before our Almighty God and how great heaven will be!

ASH WEDNESDAY-OBLIGATORY DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE! – MASS at 7PM

Lent officially begins THIS WEDNESDAY! Although it is not a holy day whereby we are obligated to attend Mass it is however, an obligatory day of fast and abstinence. ABSTINENCE– means not eating any meat, soups or gravies that are made from the meat of warm blooded animals. (Ash Wednesday and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence under pain of sin!)

LENTEN FAST—generally means only one full meal per day with meat (unless it is a day of abstinence). Two other meatless meals are allowed but the quantity of these two small meals together should not equal the amount taken at one "regular" meal. Snacking between meals is NOT ALLOWED but liquids may be taken, however, the stricter the penance the greater the grace! The laws of fasting are not binding on those with medical conditions that would cause harm to oneself or to an unborn child within the womb or the elderly over 59 years .

40 Days For Life Rally Today at 2PM/Pro Life News

The spring campaign of 40 Days for Life begins at 2 PM today February 11, with our opening rally at the Kettering abortion clinic on Stroop Road. The first of the actual 40 Days is Ash Wednesday, February 14. Please consider joining our fight this year during Lent with an hour each week of prayer and silent witness. . Recently the Ohio Supreme Court in a 5-2 decision, reversed an appellate court decision and reinstated the Ohio Department of Health license revocation order of Capital Care Network of Toledo. In this decision, the Court ruled the Ohio Department of Health had "reliable, probative, and substantial evidence" to revoke their ambulatory surgical facility license. Since 1996, the Ohio Department of Health has required all ambulatory surgical facilities, including abortion providers, to maintain a written transfer agreement with a local hospital to facilitate treatment in the event of a medical emergency. Locally, Women's Med Center, an abortion facility in Kettering, was granted an injunction by Judge Mary Wiseman in late 2017 to stay open, pending its appeal and the outcome of the Capital Care case. Women's Med Center has failed to get approval for its written transfer agreement for over a decade. Dayton Right to Life agrees with the Court decision and is grateful that the health and safety of women will be protected in the future. Dayton Right to Life's Executive Director Paul Coudron, also adds, "We also appreciate the Court's support that the standard of care expected of ALL ambulatory facilities be equally expected of abortion facilities. Why should women's care be the exception?"
