### Third Sunday of Lent

In the Epistle today, Eph 5:1-9, St Paul exhorts us to "Be imitators of God... for you were once darkness but now you are light in the Lord. Walk then as children of light". This is indeed our goal for Lent! We have received the gift of faith. We have been made children of light through our baptism. Are our deeds always the fruits of that light or are they too often signs that we are falling back into darkness? Is our language the tongue of angels praising God or do we use the tongue of the demons which we have learned from a pagan world that bombards us with its vulgarities, its curses, its blasphemies, its gossip and its lies? Recall that it is by that same tongue that we receive Our Lord in Holy Communion. It should be a nice soft pillow to receive Him and not a prickly thorn bush or a forked tongue. Do we listen to gossip from others? Should we not encourage that person to pray for the one they are tearing apart instead of being an accomplice in that sin? We are called to be light in an ever darkening world. How is our light shining?

Lent is indeed a time to brighten up that light within us by learning to avoid evil and to do good. Our mortifications should show us that our will is stronger than any attachments to this earth. Our devotions should be bringing us closer to Jesus Christ.

Let us continue our fasting, prayers and mortifications during this third week of Lent. Holy Week will be here before we know it so let's make use of each day remaining. Remember **NO DEPOSIT, NO RETURN!**

### SUGGESTIONS FOR LENT

#### THINGS TO GIVE UP

-television—your favorite show or ALL TV!

-computer—facetime, limit internet, video games

-food—dessert, meat, soft drinks, coffee, sugar, candy, chocolate or all of the above!

-fast—ALL 40 DAYS OF LENT . By a Lenten fast is meant ONE main meal with meat (unless it is a Friday) and two meatless small meals that together do not equal a "normal" meal for you with NO SNACKING in between! Remember Sundays during Lent are NOT days of Fast! Count the days on your calendar from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. It equals 40 days only if you do not count the Sundays. This is because the Resurrection of Our Lord which occurred on Sunday is always a feast day! Before Vatican II everyone was obliged to fast ALL 40 days! (unless pregnant, poor of health, or elderly)

Let us offer up our fast this year to ask God to

CLOSE THE ABORTION CLINIC in Kettering!

#### THINGS TO DO EXTRA:

-spiritual reading—Catholic Classics like: The Story of a Soul, Introduction to the Devout Life, the Imitation of Christ, Confessions, My Daily Bread.

- Daily Mass
- Holy Hour—before the Blessed Sacrament
- Increase prayer/devotions—daily family rosary, Morning Offering, Act of Contrition, Litany of the Sacred Heart, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Litany of St. Joseph, Litany of the Precious Blood.
- 15 minutes of private meditation placing yourself in the presence of God and listening to Him!
- Corporal Works of Mercy—feed or give drink to someone, Visit or call an elderly person who is alone
- Spiritual Works of Mercy—pray for the living and the dead, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences
- Confession—make a good examination of conscience and go at least once a month
- Sacred Scripture—at least 15 minutes a day
- Alms—poor box, Baby Bottles, St. Vincent de Paul
- Stations of the Cross—6 pm Fri., everyday at home
- Pray for the Pope, President, Archbishop, Pastor!
