# The Fourth Sunday of Lent—Laetare Sunday

As is evident by the rose colored vestments, today is Laetare Sunday. "Laetare" is the imperative form of the latin verb which means "rejoice". It is the first word of the introit of today's Mass taken from Isaia: "Rejoice, O Jerusalem and come together all you who love her. Rejoice you who have been in sorrow that you may exalt and be filled from the abundance of your consolation." (Isaia 66-10-11)

In today's liturgy we find the spirit of joy in the midst of penance. We find a rose amidst the prickly thorns of fasting and sacrifice. We rejoice at the thought that "we are children of promise as Isaac was". Our Creator God has made us His adopted children. We are no longer slaves to sin and death! We are heirs to the greatest kingdom that ever shall be. But before we can enter into that inheritance we need to follow the same path as He who merited it for us. He whose blood has ransomed us from an everlasting bed of thorns in this valley of tears. He whose path is marked out on the very walls of our church, the Stations of the Cross. Jesus says to each one of us. "If any man will come after me let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me!" Make the best of this second half of Lent!

22 days of Lent have passed. Only 18 remain. These final 18 will show who we are: slaves to our passions or free men willing to fast, sacrifice, pray and deny the flesh in order to obtain the Promise of everlasting life! Lent is half over! How have we done so far? CAN WE DO MORE?!!!

### SUGGESTIONS FOR LENT

### THINGS TO GIVE UP

-television-your favorite show or ALL TV!

<u>-computer</u>—facetime, limit internet, video games <u>-food</u>—dessert, meat, soft drinks, coffee, sugar, candy, chocolate or <u>all of the above!</u>

-fast—ALL 40 DAYS OF LENT. By a Lenten fast is meant ONE main meal with meat (unless it is a Friday) and two meatless small meals that together do not equal a "normal" meal for you with NO SNACKING in between! Remember Sundays during Lent are NOT days of Fast! Count the days on your calendar from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. It equals 40 days only if you do not count the Sundays. This is because the Resurrection of Our Lord which occurred on Sunday is always a feast day! Before Vatican II everyone was obliged to fast ALL 40 days! (unless pregnant, poor health, or elderly)

Let us offer up our fast this year to ask God to

### THINGS TO DO EXTRA:

-spiritual reading—Catholic Classics like: The Story of a Soul, Introduction to the Devout Life, the Imitation of Christ, Confessions, My Daily Bread.

- Daily Mass
- Holy Hour—before the Blessed Sacrament
- Increase prayer/devotions—daily family rosary,
  Morning Offering, Act of Contrition, Litany of the
  Sacred Heart, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Litany of St. Joseph, Litany of the Precious Blood.
- <u>15 minutes of private meditation placing yourself in</u> the presence of God and listening to Him!
- <u>Corporal Works of Mercy—feed or give drink to</u> someone, Visit or call an elderly person who is alone
- <u>Spiritual Works of Mercy—</u>pray for the living and the dead, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences
- <u>Confession</u>—make a good examination of conscience and go at least once a month
- Sacred Scripture—at least 15 minutes a day
- Alms—poor box, Baby Bottles, St. Vincent de Paul
- Stations of the Cross—6 pm Fri., everyday at home
- Pray for the Pope, President, Archbishop, Pastor!
