Nativity of St. John the Baptist



St John the Baptist is the only saint besides Our Lady and Our Lord whose birthday is observed by the Church. Most other Saints' feast are the day they died (birthday into heaven) or the day of the transfer of their relics. St Luke tells us in the Gospel today of the miraculous manner in which St. John was conceived by his parents Zachary and Elizabeth when she was thought to be barren and beyond child bearing. But as the Archangel Gabriel told Mary "Nothing is impossible with God"! St John was said to have been sanctified in his mother's womb at the visitation when he heard the voice of Mary who was carrying Jesus within her womb. He spent his youth in the desert fasting and praying until around the age of 30 when he began his public mission to call the people to repentance and to prepare the way of the Lord. When he saw Jesus coming he pointed Him out and said "Behold the Lamb of God" which we repeat at every Mass before Communion. He also told his disciples "I must decrease and He must increase". Words for us to follow also!
