Seventh Sunday After Pentecost

“For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is life everlasting in Christ Jesus our Lord” In the epistle today St. Paul reminds US that the end of being slaves to sin is death but being obedient to God wins life everlasting. This past Wednesday we celebrated the 242nd birthday of our country. On July 4th, 1776, The Declaration of Independence, which had been signed by 56 delegates of the 13 colonies, was ratified. In it these brave men who put their homes, family, lives and sacred honor at stake gave as the reason they could be independent from their king was that “We hold these truths to be self evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights that among these are Life, Liberty and Pursuit of Happiness” (emphasis added to indicate they did see “God” as self evident unfortunately not the case today!) How foolish this seemed to be to the British! How could 13 colonies rebel against the greatest nation in the world at the time? Yet with the help of our “Creator” we did win independence. God blessed this new republic which for some 200 years was a God fearing, mostly Christian nation not afraid to sing “God bless America” and to have “One nation under God” as a part of its pledge. During the past century our nation was indeed the instrument of God to stop “The War to End All Wars” (WWI) and also stop the subjugation of the world to totalitarian regimes run by dictators such as Hitler in WWII. God certainly blessed our nation and allowed it to become THE superpower. Yet today we see that “We the People..” as the Preamble of our Constitution begins, have now declared our independence from God with our “Supreme Court” overruling the 5th and 6th commandments. Let us therefore today declare our total dependence on our Creator God. Let us pray a good, pro life, pro family, pro God, justice will be named and sworn into so that the bad decisions be overturned! For as we read in Sacred Scripture “**Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord!”**
