



The Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's epistle, Gal 5:25-6:10, St Paul tells us: "God will not be mocked. For what a man sows, that he will also reap. For he who sows in the flesh from the flesh he will also reap corruption." How timely is this epistle as revelations have been uncovered about Cardinal McCarrick. Perhaps he thought he would get away with the evil he has done. Let us pray that there will be a cleansing of the Church, the Mystical Bride of Christ, from the top down to each and every member. Let us start with the man in the mirror. We do not wish to be a blemish on the wedding gown of the Bride of Christ! Let us pray for the Holy Father. Remember that although he is infallible when speaking of faith and morals from the Chair of St. Peter, this does not make him impeccable, unable to sin. The Holy Father goes to confession once a week- not because he is a terrible sinner but because he knows he needs to strive to be perfect as our Heavenly father is perfect. Are we willing to do our part to build up the Church? Some will use the present scandals to criticize the Church and even to stop going to Mass. We must remind them DO NOT LEAVE ST.PETER BECAUSE OF JUDAS! There have always been saints and sinners in the Church. But in the end She will be spotless! The gates of hell shall NOT prevail against her!
