HAPPY THANKSGIVING! THURS. NOV. 22nd



The origin of this national holiday actually predates the United States of America. It was celebrated by the pilgrims of the Plymouth Bay Colony under Gov. William Bradford. The previous winter had been extremely harsh in which 46 of the 102 pilgrims had died. With the help and friendship of the Wampanoag Indians, especially Squanto who taught the pilgrims where to fish, hunt and plant, they survived and even enjoyed a plentiful harvest in the year 1621. The Pilgrims therefore appropriately invited the Native Americans to celebrate a meal with them to thank God for the great harvest and His many blessings. How important for us to celebrate this national holiday and keep the tradition of thanking God for all His benefits! What better way to thank God than to come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass - the Eucharistic Feast—which goes back to the holiest Thanksgiving Feast ever, the Last Supper! Recall that the Greek word “Eucharist” actually means “Thanksgiving.” We have so much to be thankful for !

Sixth Sunday After Epiphany—Resumed

Today's Mass is the resumed Sixth Sunday After Epiphany since it was not offered earlier this year. The epistle, 1 Thess 1:2-10, is timely in that St. Paul opens with "We give thanks to God always for you all" showing the Apostle's attitude of gratitude to God in that the faith was alive and growing in spite of persecutions.

In the Gospel Our Lord uses the parables which compare the growth of the Church to the tiny mustard seed and the yeast that raises up the dough way beyond its original size. The spread of the Church from 12 apostles to 1.2 billion is a proof of its divine origin. It is from God and it is with God. Jesus identifies with His Church. In converting St. Paul He said "Saul, Saul why do you persecute **ME?**" Knowing this how **GRATEFUL** we should be to Him who has made us members of His kingdom on earth with the assurance of becoming members of His eternal kingdom **IF** we remain His loyal citizens here below. Ask yourself—Am I growing in my Faith and in virtue? Am I leaven for the Mystical Body of Christ? If not Why Not?!
