## Second Sunday of Lent

In today's epistle St. Paul encourages the Thessalonians—and us too on this second Sunday of Lent—"to make even greater progress for this is the will of God, YOUR SANCTIFICATION"! In the Gospel Saints Peter, James and John accompany Our Lord up Mount Tabor and they get a glimpse of who this Jesus really is! Jesus reveals His divinity to them by letting it shine through His humanity. His face glowed like the sun and His vestments became white as snow. He appears with Moses and Elijah (Elijah is the Hebrew name sometimes translated into Greek and Latin as Elias) as witnesses to Him representing the Law and the Prophets. Their presence with Jesus is another proof of the immortality of the soul and eternal life. This is the prize for sanctification. St. Peter wanted to set up tents to already begin the celebration but Our Lord remind him that He must suffer and die first before receiving His glory. So during this time of Lent let us keep our eyes on the prize. If we wish to reign with Jesus we too must first sacrifice, suffer and die to make up for our sins. This is the will of God OUR SANCTIFICATION!

## HAPPY ST. PATRICK'S DAY!



How appropriate this great feast falls in Lent each year since it was through privations, sufferings and fastings that he heard the voice of God. Although born in Scotland he was kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland when only 16 years of age. He was made to care for cattle in the mountains amidst snow, ice and rain with very little food and clothing. Yet it was there that he heard the voice of God and his faith and love for Him grew strong in his tender soul. After escaping back to Scotland he was ordained and actually asked to go back to the very people who had enslaved him! The rest is history. It is said he drove snakes off the Emerald Island and converted a pagan culture to the one true faith. The Irish, once converted actually sent missionaries to convert Europe. Let us celebrate this feast not in drunkenness but rather praising God in all things! Let us ask this great saint to help us cultivate a love and awe for Almighty God during this Lenten time of fast and abstinence. ST. PATRICK—PRAY FOR US!!
