### **GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY**



The Second Sunday after Easter is known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" due to the references made in both the epistle as well as in the Gospel where Our Lord identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd.


St . Peter's epistle is just as relevant

today as it was when he wrote it @ 63 AD. The First Pope, the first Shepherd of the Church, reminds us from his own experience on Good Friday "for you were as sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls" (1Peter 2:25).

In the Gospel Our Lord states very clearly to the Pharisees "I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep". He did fulfil perfectly His role. "I know mine and mine know me". He knows us better than we know ourselves. Our Good shepherd calls us back to the fold whenever we begin to wander. When we became entangled in the bitter thorns of this life and became easy pray for the wolves and the vultures. Yet we had only to cry out to Him and He heard our voice and tenderly removed us from the mess in which we had gotten ourselves into. Through the sacrament of Penance we are freed from those thorns and taken back into the protection of the fold where we have found peace and shelter from

our ancient foe and his demons.

#### THE MONTH OF MAY IS DEDICATED TO MARY



"I know mine and mine know Me" How well do you know your Good Shepherd? Do you pray to Him daily? Do you listen to His voice? Do you stay close to Him? Our Good Shepherd speaks to us not only every day but every second of our existence. He is God. He can do that! Not one sparrow falls to the ground without Him knowing it.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday let us determine to be like those intelligent sheep who stay near their shepherd, hear His voice, call back to Him regularly, speak to Him in prayer, visit Him in the

Blessed Sacrament, receive Him in Holy Communion & let Him heal our wounds in confession. Remember it is the sheep who wander from their shepherd that become easy pray for the wolves

come in the past. Hear His voice so we may enter into that eternal green pasture and live with Him Forever!
