### **SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST**

How appropriate the Sacred Scriptures are for us today during this time after Pentecost.

Has the coming of the Holy Ghost into our souls brought forth any good fruit? Have we grown in our faith or have we fallen backwards? St Paul admonishes us in the Epistle, Romans 6:19-23, " But now set free from sin and be slaves to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification and as your end life everlasting. # FIRST FRIDAY & FIRST SATURDAY-this week!

Friday confessions begin at 6:30 PM, Saturday Holy Hour begins at 8AM with exposition, rosary, confessions, private prayer and benediction. Our Lord and Lady asked that these devotions be made in reparation for sins. Great promises and grace to those who fulfil their requests—especially eternal life!

The Portiuncula Indulgence Friday Aug 2nd St. Francis, repaired three chapels. The third was popularly called the Portiuncula which literally means "the Little Portion", dedicated to St. Mary of the Angels, that was given to the Franciscans from the Benedictins and is now enclosed in a sanctuary at Assisi.

The friars came to live at the Little Portion in early 1211. It became the "motherhouse" of the Franciscans. This is where St. Francis first founded the Order, where St. Clare came to the friars to make her vows during the night following Palm Sunday in 1212 and where "Sister Death" came to St. Francis on the 3rd of October 1226.

On a night in July, 1216, Francis was praying in the little church of the Portiuncula devoured by love for God and a thirst to save souls. He prayed for the forgiveness of sins of mankind. Suddenly a brilliant light shone all around. In great splendor Jesus and Mary appeared in the midst of a dazzling cloud surrounded by a multitude of radiant angels. Out of fear and reverence, St. Francis adored Our Lord prostrate upon the ground. Then Jesus said to him: Francis you are very zealous for the good of souls. Ask me what you

want for their salvation. St. Francis was rapt in ecstasy before Jesus. When he regained his courage he said: "Lord, I a miserable sinner, beg You to concede an indulgence to all those who enter this church, who are truly contrite and have confessed their sins. And I beg Blessed Mary, your Mother, intercessor of man, that she intercede on behalf of this grace." Our Lady at once began to beseech her Son on behalf of Francis. Jesus answered: It is a very great thing that which you ask Me; but you are worthy of even greater things, Friar Francis, and greater things you will have. So I accept your request, but I want you to go to my Vicar, to whom I have given the power to bind and loose in Heaven and on earth, to ask him on my behalf for this indulgence.

With one of his companions, Francis hastened to Pope Honorius III and prostrate implored him to proclaim that every one visiting the church and confessing their sins with a contrite heart would be as pure from all sin and punishments as he was immediately after baptism.

The Pope granted this petition. This indulgence has been extended to all parish churches throughout the world. To obtain the Portiuncula plenary indulgence, a person must visit the Chapel of Our Lady of the Angels at Assisi, or a Franciscan sanctuary, or one's parish church, with the intention of honoring Our Lady of the Angels. Then perform the work of reciting the Creed and Our Father along with the usual conditions for gaining a plenary indulgence.

Plenary Indulgence Definition: An indulgence is a remission before God of all the temporal punishment (purgatory time) due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. ( CCC ¶ 1471) The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are: - detachment from ALL sin (which is a true sorrow for, and repudiation of, all one's sin, mortal and venial} - reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought; - prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice); - sacramental confession within twenty days of completion of the prescribed work.
