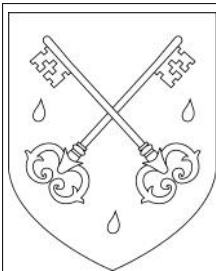

Eighth Sunday After Pentecost

"You have received a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry 'Abba! Father!'" Today's words from St. Paul (Rom. 8:2-17), remind us how blessed we are that Almighty God, who created us from the dust of the earth, redeemed us from eternal death by sending His only Son, sent His Holy Spirit to sanctify us so that we can be made worthy to enter the kingdom of heaven, wants us to call Him "Father"! When the apostles asked Our Lord to teach them to pray He taught them - and us- to say "Our Father".

The story of salvation history is far more exciting and more incredible than anything Hollywood could ever dream up! And yet it is a TRUE story that each and everyone of us plays a part in! It is the greatest love story ever told especially when we contemplate the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord! Yet since true love is one that is freely given and must be freely received God has also given us a free will. We can accept or reject His great offer of love, freedom from sin, adoption as His children and to the eternal happiness of a mansion in our Father's house forever!

Only a fool would reject this offer. Yet sadly there are many fools. In today's Gospel Our Lord presents to us the Parable of the Unjust Steward. It is not the unjust steward's lying and stealing that the Master commends but rather his foresight in preparing for the future! How much time do we devote to gaining our eternal inheritance? After deducting 8 hours for work and 8 hours for sleep each day that leaves 56 hours each week which could be considered "free time". How many of these hours do I devote to heaven? Will one hour at Mass on Sunday be enough? The keen businessman with all his work hours still finds time to gain friends and read books to benefit his life. Do we seek out spiritual friends and readings that would help us gain our spiritual happiness? Our Lord reminds us—BE PREPARED!

Now that the fiscal year has ended we are working on the annual report. Unlike the unjust steward in the Gospel we have certainly made good use of Our Masters money as will be evident by the report. Although a few more checks that we have paid still have to be cashed before we can officially close the month of June 2019 and therefore the fiscal year, it appears we will be \$85,000 under budget this year and have over \$636,000 in our savings with the Archdiocese earning 2.35% interest! That was \$6,772.83 for the first half of the year! Try to get that from a bank these days!! As recently reported the Archdiocese Insurance helped cover the damage done by the rock thrower and a generous parishioner has offered to pay for the final repair of the stain glass which would closely equal our deductible. We will also mention some of the improvements we have made recently, again at little cost for the work done thanks to some very generous parishioners! Fr. Gabet has been in close communication with the Archdiocese Finance Office and has met with the Finance Committee. The final report will be forthcoming in a few weeks. We have indeed been like Nehemiah in Esdras 4-16-18. Defending with the sword in one hand while building with the other! Please continue to pray for Holy Family and her pastor!
