The Feast of Christ the King

According to the Latin Mass calendar now known as the "Extraordinary Form", today the last Sunday of October, is the Feast of Christ the King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in an attempt to stem the tide of secular humanism that grew out of the so called "enlightenment" of the 18th and 19th centuries which sees man as the center of the universe who creates "god" in his own image and likeness. Secular Humanism is therefore a way of life that leaves God out of man's thinking and living, organizing one's life as if God did not exist. This feast by which we as Catholics proclaim our fidelity and love to such a gracious King is therefore intended to protect us from such heresy which actually dates back to our first parents and that first lie of the ancient serpent to Eve which caused the eviction of mankind from the Garden of Eden "you too shall be like gods". Concealed Carry Policy state/archdiocese/Parish

Regarding Church Buildings: The Ohio State law provides that a concealed handgun may not be carried into any church or other place of worship unless the church or other place of worship permits otherwise. Archbishop Schnurr has determined that whether concealed handguns are permitted in any church building is left to the discretion of the pastor of the church. This authorization from the pastor must be a written authorization and given only to an individual with a CCW Per-

mit and only to meet a security need.
