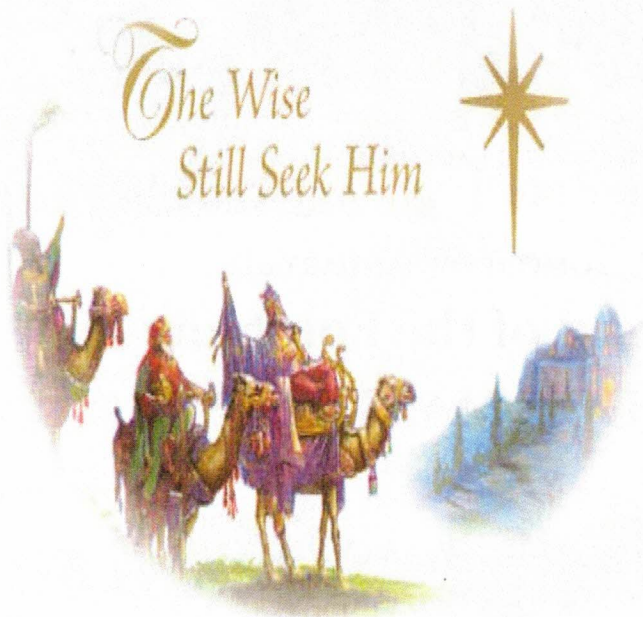
## Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

Today we celebrate this feast which recalls to our mind who this Child is: "Jesus" means "God saves" in Hebrew. We are also reminded by St Paul in Phil. 2:10-11 "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth". We were taught in elementary school to bow our heads every time we hear that Holy Name of Jesus. Since it belongs to the Second Person of the Trinity it has great power. Our Lord Himself told us "whatever you ask the Father IN MY NAME He will give it to you" Jn 16:23. The Holy Name is powerful for it designates the mystery, the power and the mission of the Son of Man who came to save us. To call upon His Holy Name is to appeal to the infinite merits of His passion, death and resurrection. For this reason the Catholic Church has always preached, blessed, cast out demons and performed miracles through the name of Jesus. Mankind finds in the Holy Name all that it needs and all that it longs for: peace, pardon, love, joy, power over demons, eternal life and God's great mercy.
