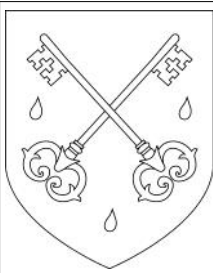

The Third Sunday After Epiphany

Today the Introit, Gradual, Offertory and Communion all testify to Our Lord's Divinity. In the Extraordinary Form we continue to rejoice that our Messiah has come. We prepared for Him during Advent. NEXT SUNDAY FEAST OF THE PURIFICATION

This Feast is also known as "Candlemas Day". Although sinless the Mother of God submits herself to the Law of Moses. She and St. Joseph offer the two turtle doves required and present their first born son in the temple. Holy Simeon recognizes Him and thanks the Heavenly Father that he has lived to see the Salvation of God. The blessed candles symbolize, Jesus, the Light of the World. Their flame enlightens our darkness. The wax made by bees from the nectar of flowers represents the virginal flesh of Our Lord that is consumed for love of us! The wick within the wax is His souls that bears the flame, His Divinity, that disperses the darkness. All the evil of the world cannot put out the light of the smallest candle. The blessing of the candles consists of 5 beautiful prayers. These candles may be taken home by the faithful as powerful sacramentals to be used during prayer, especially the family rosary, in times of trouble such as during storms, times of trouble and especially at the hour of death. You may bring candles to receive the special blessing and place them on the table in the sanctuary BEFORE 10:30 Mass. Please label them so there is no confusion as to whom they belong. We will also have candles available. A \$5 donation would be appreciated.
