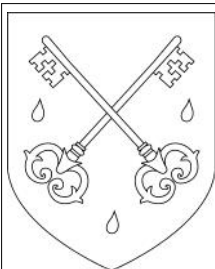

Candlemas —Feast of the Purification



Today is the feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although she was without sin she followed the law of Moses. This feast is traditionally known as CANDLEMAS as candles receive a special blessing and a procession is made into the church in remembrance of Our Lady bringing the Christ Child—the Light of the World—into the temple. This is also the Presentation. The first born was presented in the temple and “bought back” from God with a lamb or two turtle doves. How ironic that He who created all the lambs and was Himself the Lamb of God could not afford a lamb at His presentation. Holy Simeon recognizes the Child as the Messiah and foretells that the sword of sorrow will pass through Mary’s heart. It is therefore the Fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary but also the first of the Seven Sorrows of Our Sorrowful Mother. Candles will be blessed before the High Mass so be sure to label your candles and have them on the table in the sanctuary BEFORE 10:30 Mass begins! Extra candles will be blessed for home use. A \$5 donation will help cover the cost of these candles.

Monday-Feb 3rd commemoration of St. Blaise. Blessing of throats following 7PM Mass. As St. Blaise was being led to his death a mother begged him to save the life of her child who was choking on a bone. The saint stopped and healed him!

FIRST FRIDAY

Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary, "In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour." What a bargain! **9 First Fridays to gain ETERNAL LIFE!** Who would not accept that offer? This promise is the last of 12 promises connected to the Devotion to the Sacred Heart which include the following:

- (1) I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- (2) I will establish peace in their homes.
- (3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my heart is exposed and honored.
- 10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart never to be effaced.

Next Sunday is our Commitment weekend for the 2020 Catholic Ministries Appeal.
