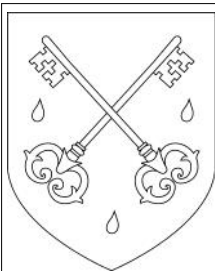

## SEXAGESIMA SUNDAY

### The parable of the Sower and the Seed



It is indeed interesting to note that Our Lord was actually doing what he was speaking about in relating this parable. He was spreading the seed of faith among all those who had come to listen to Him. Remember, God has been sowing since the dawn of time. Starting with Adam and Eve and continuing to this day and will continue until the sound of the trumpet signaling the final gathering of the harvest on the last Day.

Our Lord explains the parable to His apostles and TO US!

**The seed is THE WORD OF GOD!**

**The seed by the wayside - those who hear the Word but the demons, like birds, easily take it from their heart.**

**The seed on the rock—cannot take root so it dies. They rejoice at first but without roots they fall away in time of temptation. Their hearts are much too hard!**

**The seed among thorns - those who hear and believe for a while but are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of this life and their fruit does not ripen.**

**The seed that falls upon good soil bears fruit a hundred fold. As any gardener knows to get good soil that hard soil must be tilled and broken! It must be manured and given water & nutrients! In other words it must be humbled and must receive the graces that our Good Lord provides especially through prayer, good works and the sacraments from Holy Mother Church! Which type of soil will He find in YOUR heart? Lent can prepare that soil! Denial of ones own will breaks up that soil and the sacraments, prayers & practice of virtues enriches it!**

**A good Lent will prepare your heart to grow that seed!!**
