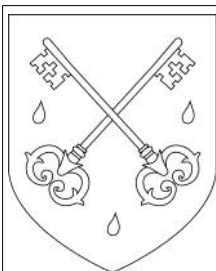

Ninth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's gospel we read the account of Our Lord weeping over Jerusalem. "If thou had known, in this thy day, the things that are for thy peace! For days will come upon thee when thy enemies will throw up a rampart about thee and surround and shut thee in on every side and will dash thee to the ground and thy children within thee and will not leave in thee one stone upon another because thou has not known the time of thy visitation."

Our Lord was crying over Jerusalem for being God he knew that of their own free will the high priest and the Sanhedrin, the leaders of what had been "God's Chosen People" were going to reject their own Savior, the one God had sent them to be the Messiah. Because of their rejection they would be destroyed. Jesus' prophecy did come true. Some 40 years later, 70 AD, Titus, the Roman General took Jerusalem, that once Holy City, and after a long siege which caused death by starvation of many hundred thousands of its inhabitants, leveled it to the ground. Thousands of survivors were sold as slaves. The famous Jewish historian, Josephus, wrote: "The whole circuit of the city was so thoroughly leveled and dug up that no one visiting it would believe that it had once been inhabited."

This was the price of rejecting God and His law. This was the price of saying we will do what we want. We will be our own gods. We too when we reject God and lose His protection fall into the hands of the enemy by default. Pray for our country and for ourselves that we do not become like that Jerusalem!

THE PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE

“The Portiuncula “Little Portion” was a small old church dedicated to the Blessed Mother near Assisi, which was abandoned. St. Francis upon seeing that the church was deserted, he began to live there constantly in order to repair it. This “Little Portion” was later given to the Franciscans. St. Francis loved this spot more than any other in the world. It was here he began his religious life in a very small way; where he founded his order received from Jesus his mission to “rebuild His Church” both physically and spiritually, and it is here he came to a happy death. When he was dying, he commended this spot above all others to the friars, because it was most dear to the Blessed Virgin. Today a basilica surrounds the Church. The Portiuncula indulgence was first granted to this particular Church dedicated to Mary, that was so connected to St. Francis.

It was then extended to all Franciscan Churches and eventually extended to all parish churches throughout the world on August 2nd. Be sure to take advantage of this grace!
