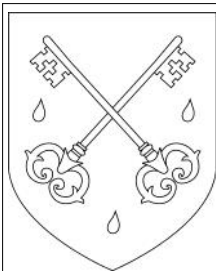

The Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

In today's epistle, Gal. 5:25-6:10, St Paul admonishes us "While we have time let us do good to all men."

Even if someone is caught doing something wrong we cannot gossip about them. Instead a good Catholic prays for them realizing that we are not perfect either. We must remind ourselves "but for the grace of God there go I!" If someone has done something to harm us or even just something that annoys us let us remember the words Our Lord Himself worked into the Our Father whereby we set the limits on how much we want God to forgive us by how much we forgive others: "forgive us our trespasses (HOW MUCH?) as we forgive those who trespass against us." By forgiving others we show that the Holy Spirit is alive in us and that WE want to be forgiven as well.

This past year we missed Divine Mercy Sunday due to Covid and the Pastor being in the hospital. Today's epistle reminds us of the A B C's of Divine Mercy:

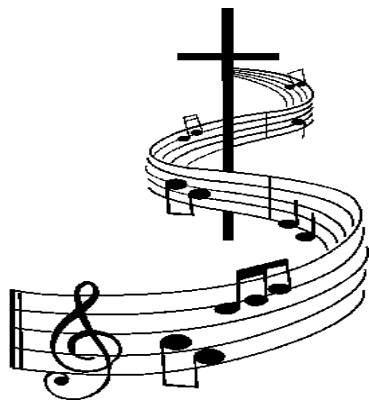
- A- Ask for mercy (especially frequent confessions)

September 14/Exaltation of the Holy Cross

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates two historical events: the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320 under the temple of Venus in Jerusalem, and the dedication in 335 of the basilica and shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which mark the site of the Crucifixion. The basilica, and the shrine, were destroyed by the Persians in 614. The Church of the Holy Sepulcher which now stands on the site was built by the crusaders in 1149. However the feast, more than anything else, is a celebration and commemoration of God's greatest work: his salvific death on the Cross and His Resurrection, through which death was defeated and the doors to Heaven opened. How much Jesus humbled Himself, suffering and dying on a cross in order to reopen the gates of heaven for us!

"HOLY LAND 2nd COLLECTION TODAY

This second collection that is usually taken up on Good Friday was missed this year due to the Carona virus. As announced last week we will be having it TODAY Instead. The collection goes to the Commissariat of the Holy Land that supports the preservation of such Christian places as the Holy Sepulcher, the Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, the Garden of Olives and Calvary which we especially will be thinking of tomorrow, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.
