## Nineteenth Sunday After Pentecost

"Be renewed in the spirit of your mind and put on the new man which has been created according to God". These words from the epistle certainly are applicable to their author, St. Paul and to us following this tough year! But let us not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good! In everyone's life there comes a day when we receive a special gift from God—a calling—an invitation. For St. Paul it was on the road to Damascus when Our Lord knocked him off of his high horse and said "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?" Saul answered the call and even changed his name to Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles and he never looked back! He and all the saints of God were struck by grace and a call to "put on the new man", a call to truly be a creature of God and answer the call to holiness, an invitation they all whole heartedly accepted.
