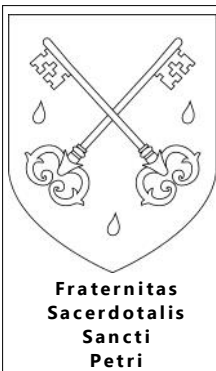

### St. Peter in Chains named a Minor Basilica!!

Yesterday the Archdiocese of Cincinnati celebrated a special Mass in recognition of the 175-anniversary of the dedication of the Cathedral. The Cathedral was formally dedicated on Nov. 2, 1845 and re-dedicated on Nov. 3, 1957. That is why we offered the Mass last Tuesday here at Holy Family Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr celebrated the Mass yesterday for more people to be able to attend. In addition, earlier this year, Pope Francis designated the Cathedral of St. Peter in Chains in Cincinnati as a Minor Basilica and, as is customary, the Basilica is now permitted to display the three symbols granted in virtue of that title.

The symbols are visible reminders of the spiritual bond the church has with the Universal Church and the Pope.

The *Ombrellino* (little umbrella) is a distinctive symbol used in basilicas throughout the world. Designed with stripes of yellow and red (traditional papal colors), the silk canopy is a symbol of the Pope's authority. During the Middle Ages, the *Ombrellino* would be carried above the Holy Father during processions. Once placed, the *Ombrellino* remains partially open in as a symbol of readiness to welcome the Holy Father.



The *Tintinnabulum* (bells), like the *Ombrellino*, indicates that The Cathedral Basilica of Saint Peter in Chains has a special relationship with the Holy Father.

The *Tintinnabulum*, a bell mounted on a pole, is placed in a Roman Catholic Basilica to signify the church's link with the Pope. During the Middle Ages and Renaissance, the *Tintinnabulum* was used to alert the people of Rome of the approach of the Holy Father during papal processions.



The *Papal Cross Keys* are the symbol of the Papacy, and represent the keys refer to the promise of Christ to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in Heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in Heaven." (Matthew 16:19). The presence of the keys symbolizes the continuous relationship of the Basilica to the Holy Father in Rome.
