Resumed: Sixth Sunday After Epiphany

WHAT? 6th Sunday after Epiphany in November?
Believe it or not there is method to the madness!

Due to the fact that Easter is a movable feast (ie not on a specific date like Christmas, Dec25th) the number of Sundays after Epiphany to Septuagesima Sunday and the number of Sundays after Pentecost to Advent are variable depending on when Easter falls each year. If Easter is early there are less Sundays after Epiphany so these Sundays are added between the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost and the 24th (and Last) Sunday after Pentecost. Therefore the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany which was not offered before Septuagesima began will be offered today. The 24th Sun. After Pentecost is always the last Sun. before Advent due to the nature of its epistle and Gospel regarding the end of time which is indeed suitable for the last Sun. of the Liturgical Year. So yes indeed today's Mass is the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany!

Plenary Indulgence for the Poor Souls

The Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1st to 8th November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, and prays even if only mentally for the faithfully departed, on any day in November, under the usual conditions. Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, 2nd November, this year, it can be obtained not only on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month. The indulgence is obtained by devoutly visiting a church or an oratory along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed under the usual conditions of Confession (about 20 days before of after), Holy Communion, prayers for the intentions of the Pope {Our Father & Hail Mary suffice) and detachment from all sin. What power Holy Mother Church has bestowed on us—the ability to get someone into heaven!!! Let's be sure to take advantage of this great mercy and act of charity for the Poor Souls!!
