The parable of the Sower and the Seed. It is indeed interesting to note that Our Lord was actually doing what he was speaking about in relating this parable. He was spreading the seed of faith among all those who had come to listen to Him. Remember. God has been sowing since the dawn of time. Starting with Adam and Eve and continuing to this day and will continue until the sound of the trumpet signaling the final gathering of the harvest on the last Day. "He sows, never heeding the waste,

never crushed by the ingratitude, never tired by the toil, He plants where hope has failed Him a hundred times, He
