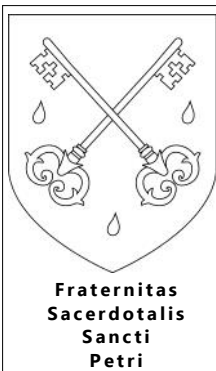

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

Today is the last Sunday before Lent. In the epistle St. Paul exhorts us to practice the greatest of all virtues which is charity. In the Gospel we have the proof of God's charity to us. Jesus tells His apostles that He is going to Jerusalem and that He will be mocked, scourged, spit upon and then they will put Him to death. He sets His Face towards Calvary!

Greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends. Jesus knows exactly what is going to happen to Him yet He still goes for love of us.

What will we do for love of Him this Lent? Like the blind man in the Gospel today let us ask—"O Lord that I may see!" How much we would be willing to sacrifice if we could truly see how much He loves us and suffered for us, how terrible our sins are before our Almighty God and how great heaven will be!

ASH WEDNESDAY-OBLIGATORY DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE! – MASS at 7PM

Lent officially begins THIS WEDNESDAY! Although it is not a holy day whereby we are obligated to attend Mass it is however, an obligatory day of fast and abstinence.

ABSTINENCE– means not eating any meat, soups or gravies that are made from the meat of warm blooded animals. (Ash Wednesday and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence under pain of sin!)

LENTEN FAST—generally means only one full meal per day with meat (unless it is a day of abstinence). Two other meatless meals are allowed but the quantity of these two small meals together should not equal the amount taken at one "regular" meal. Snacking between meals is NOT ALLOWED but liquids may be taken, however, the stricter the penance the greater the grace! The laws of fasting are not binding on those with medical conditions that would cause harm to oneself or to an unborn child within the womb or the elderly over 59 years old.

HAPPY ST. VALENTINE'S DAY

On this day as we remember those we love with flowers, chocolates and Valentine cards let us remember Our Lord's



words "greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends" This is what St. Valentine, Priest and Martyr, did on this day around 270 AD. He laid down his life for Christ being beaten with clubs and then beheaded during the persecution under Claudius II. But it was indeed Our Lord Himself who initially proved His love for us on that first Good Friday. The crucifix is truly a "Valentine" for each and every one of us! Behold His arms spread wide to show how much He loves us, His head bowed to kiss us. His heart—the source of all love—is opened wide for us! Truly "greater love than THIS no man has!" This is why we as Catholics hold dear not just the cross but the crucifix which has the "corpus" or body of Christ boldly displayed. For it was here for three long hours at the crucifixion that He won our redemption and showed His infinite love for us! Let us therefore not forget Him today as our dearest love! He invites you today to his Feast, a representation of the Last Supper and Calvary where instead of chocolates He gives us His Flesh and Blood as our spiritual food. So much sweeter than chocolate for it is a pledge of eternal life and happiness with Him. "He who eats my flesh and drinks my Blood shall have Life Everlasting and I shall raise him up on the last day!" His Sacred Heart being a part of His divine humanity is therefore the infinite source of ALL love and still pours forth its Blood and water for us today—His grace and Mercy! What can we give Him today that He as Creator God does not possess? Let us give Him our hearts! First of all cleansing them from all our sins! Let us prepare to show Him beginning this Wednesday the start of Lent how much we love Him through our prayers and penances as we accompany Him on the way to Calvary!
