ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

We can apply the last words of the gospel to ourselves today "He has made the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak". In curing the deaf mute Jesus touched the man's ears and said "ephpheta" an Aramaic word that means "be opened". Immediately the deaf mute heard the word of Jesus and spoke to others about Him even at the risk of persecution. What would you think if that deaf mute deliberately deprived himself of his hearing and speech after he was miraculously cured? That is exactly what the Catholic who gives up the practice of his faith does! At Baptism the same word "ephpheta" was spoken to us by the priest, an "alter Christus", "another Christ"! He prayed that our ears would be opened to the Word of God. Let us realize what a great gift this is to know God through His Word and then tell others about Him! This is how we fulfill our purpose in life to know, love and serve God so that we can be happy with Him in heaven.

St Paul in the epistle is a shining example of hearing speaking & living the faith. He had been struck blind on the road to Damascus but by the grace of God his eyes were opened and he became a true apostle of Christ. May we also be able to say, when we have accomplished our mission, "But by the grace of God I am what I am and His grace has not been Fruitless". Let us truly hear the Word of God and speak that "Word" to others!
