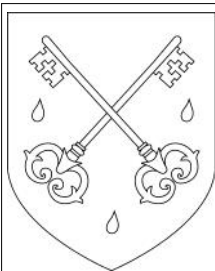

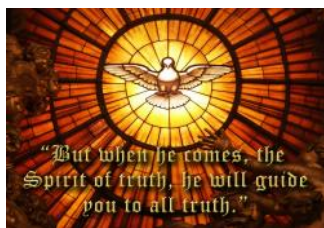

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

Today is the last Sunday before Lent. In the epistle St. Paul exhorts us to practice the greatest of all virtues which is charity. In the Gospel we have the proof of God's charity to us. Jesus tells His apostles that He is going to Jerusalem and that He will be mocked, scourged, spit upon and then they will put Him to death. He sets His Face towards Calvary! "Greater love than this no man has that he lay down his life for his friends". Jesus knows exactly what is going to happen to Him yet He still goes for love of us. What will we do for love of Him this Lent? Like the blind man in the Gospel today let us ask—"O Lord that I may see!" How much we would be willing to sacrifice if we could truly see how much He loves us and suffered for us, how terrible our sins are before our Almighty God and how great heaven will be!

ASH WEDNESDAY-OBLIGATORY DAY OF

FAST AND ABSTINENCE! – MASSSES at 7AM & 7PM- Lent officially begins **THIS WEDS!** Although not a holy day whereby we are obligated to attend Mass it is however, an obligatory day of fast & abstinence. ABSTINENCE– means not eating any meat, soups or gravies that are made from the meat of warm blooded animals. (Ash Wednesday and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent are days of abstinence under pain of sin!) LENTEN FAST—generally means only one full meal per day with meat (unless it is a day of abstinence). Two other meatless meals are allowed but the quantity of these two small meals together should not equal the amount taken at one "regular" meal. Snacking between meals is **NOT ALLOWED** but liquids may be taken, however, the stricter the penance the greater the grace! The laws of fasting are not binding on those with medical conditions that would cause harm to oneself or to an unborn child within the womb or the elderly over 59 years old.

SPRING CAMPAIGN OF 40 DAYS FOR LIFE.

The Dayton 40 Days for Life campaign begins at 2 PM TODAY, February 27 with an opening rally at the abortion clinic on Stroop Road in Kettering. Our featured speaker is Margie Christie of Dayton Right to Life, who will review the tragic 50-year history of abortion in Dayton, beginning with Roe v. Wade in 1973. We also encourage you to sign up for sidewalk vigil hours during the 40 days of the campaign, from Wednesday, March 2 through Palm Sunday, April 10. We need a minimum of one person per hour each day from 7 AM to 7 PM (1-7 PM coverage on Sundays). Flyers are at the entrances to the church. Please join us in prayer, fasting, and public witness for the sanctity of life and pray especially for divine guidance on our nine Supreme Court justices in the coming weeks.

SUGGESTIONS FOR LENT

THINGS TO GIVE UP:

- television—your favorite show or ALL TV!
- computer—facetime, limit internet, games
- food:dessert, meat, soft drinks, coffee, sugar, candy, chocolate or all of the above!
- FAST—ALL 40 DAYS OF LENT. Remember Sundays during Lent are NOT days of Fast! . This is because the Resurrection of Our Lord which occurred on Sunday is always a feast day! Before Vatican II everyone was obliged to fast ALL 40 days! (unless pregnant, in poor health, or elderly)

THINGS TO DO EXTRA:

- spiritual reading—Catholic Classics like: The Story of a Soul, Intro.to the Devout Life, the Imitation of Christ, Spiritual Exercises
- Daily Mass/Holy Hour—especially before the Holy Eucharist or a crucifix
- Increase Prayer/devotions—daily family rosary, Morning Offering, Act of Contrition, Holy Face
- 15 minutes of private meditation placing yourself in the presence of God and listening to Him!

- Corporal Works of Mercy—feed or give drink to someone, Visit or call an elderly person or someone else who is alone, bury the dead
- Spiritual Works of Mercy—pray for the living and the dead, comfort the afflicted, forgive, bear wrongs patiently, comfort the afflicted
- Confession—make a good examination of conscience and go at least once a month
- Sacred Scripture—at least 15 minutes a day
