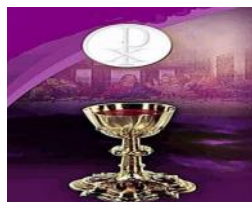

Third Sunday of Lent

In the Epistle today, Eph 5:1-9, St Paul exhorts us to “Be imitators of God... for you were once darkness but now you are light in the Lord. Walk then as children of light”. This is indeed our goal for Lent! We have received the gift of faith. We have been made children of light through our baptism. Are our deeds always the fruits of that light or are they too often signs that we are falling back into darkness? Is our language the tongue of angels praising God or do we use the tongue of the demons which we have learned from a pagan world that bombards us with its vulgarities, its curses, its blasphemies, its gossip and its lies? Recall that it is by that same tongue that we receive Our Lord in Holy Communion. It should be a nice soft pillow to receive Him and not a prickly thorn bush or a forked tongue. Do we listen to gossip from others? Should we not encourage that person to pray for the one they are tearing apart instead of being an accomplice in that sin? We are called to be light in an ever darkening world. How is our light shining? Can we shine more?

Lent is indeed a time to brighten up that light within us by learning to avoid evil and to do good. Our mortifications should show us that our will is stronger than any attachments to this earth. Our devotions should be bringing us closer to Jesus Christ.

Let us continue our fasting, prayers and mortifications during this third week of Lent. Holy Week will be here before we know it so let's make use of each day remaining. Remember NO DEPOSIT, NO RETURN!

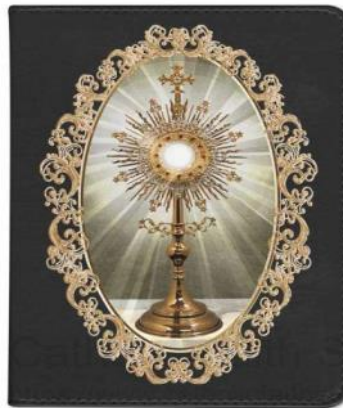

SUGGESTIONS FOR LENT

Things to give up:

TV, facebook, e-mail, games, smoking, drinks-
Food: dessert, meat, soft drinks, coffee, sugar,
candy, chocolate or all of the above!

Fast: ALL 40 Days!, By a Lenten fast is meant one
full meal with meat {except on Friday} and two
small meatless meals that together do not equal a
full meal. NO SNACKING! Sundays are not part of
the 40 days & NOT considered days of fast.

Things to do for Lent:

- spiritual reading - (Spiritual Classics Every Catholic
should read: -*The Story of a Soul* (St. Therese of Li-
sieux), *The Imitation of Christ*). *Introduction to
the Devout Life*—St Francis de Sales (Translation
by Fr. John Ryan), *Confessions* by St. Augustine.
daily Mass- Holy Hour before Blessed Sacrament
(every Monday)--Increase prayer esp. rosary,
Morning Offering, Act of Contrition, Litany of the
Sacred Heart, Litany of the Precious Blood, 15
minutes of private meditation placing yourself in
the presence of God-Confession-Sacred Scrip-
ture—(Douay –Rheims or Confraternity Bible)
Pick one or more of the above and remember God
will not be outdone in generosity!!
