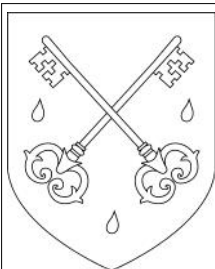

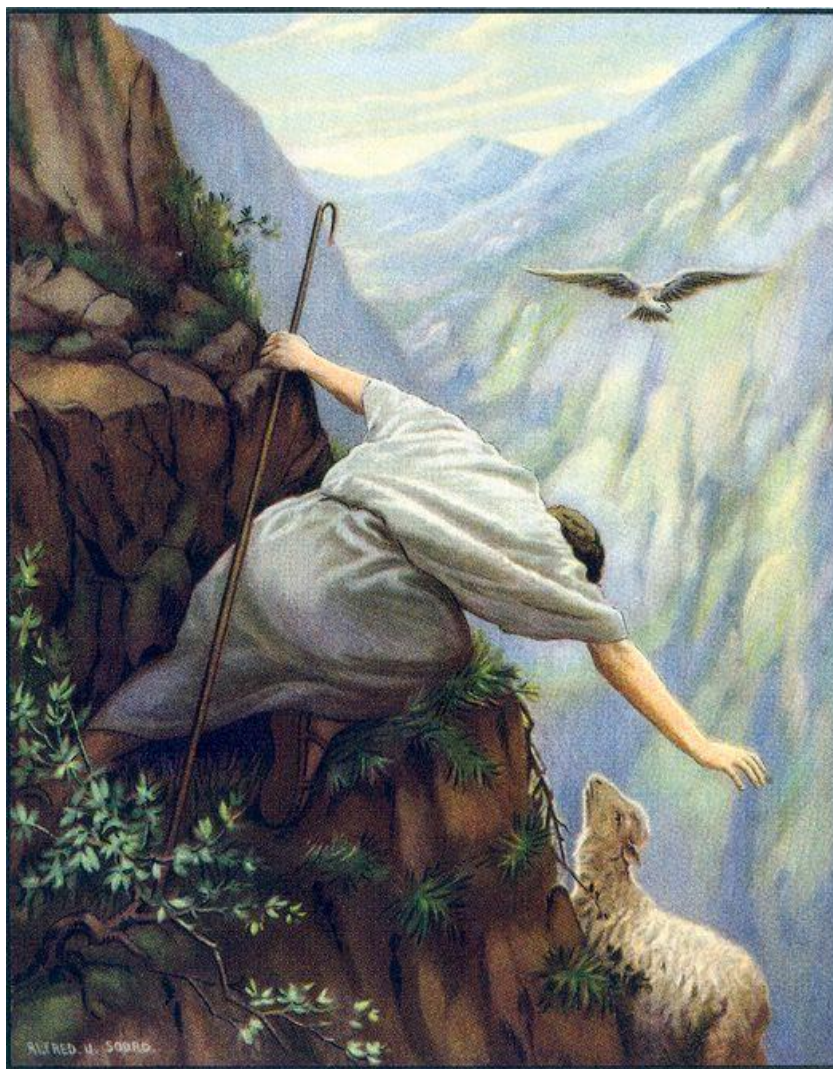

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

“I am the Good Shepherd, I know mine and mine know me, even as the Father knows me and I know the Father: and I lay down my life for my sheep” (JN 10:14)

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

The paschal joy which now permeates our liturgy and hopefully our lives, is inseparable from the freedom from sin and the hope of our participation in divine life with Our Risen Lord. Like a seed this blessed joy is destined to grow and blossom into the Beatific Vision, seeing God face to face IF we stay near Our Good Shepherd and hear His voice.

Hopefully our Lenten fasts and sacrifices have made us stronger. How are we able to persevere in the joy and grace that we accomplished this past Lent? In the words of St. Peter's epistle today it is by being "strangers and pilgrims" to the things of this world. In other words by not becoming too attached to them.

Let us not fall back but rather continue to grow closer to Christ realizing the pleasures of this world are only transitory. We will have to

leave EVERYTHING behind one day—including our body! Our first Pope and Good Shepherd to the flock has encouraged us to refrain from carnal desires that war against the soul! Lent and Easter have been a passage from suffering to joy, from ashes to new life in Christ. Our Lord Himself makes it clear in the Gospel today that His pain and suffering are a prelude of His coming into glory. During our "little while" here on earth we too must suffer but if we stay close to our Good Shepherd our sorrows will also blossom into joy! As He promises us "You therefore have sorrow now but I will see you again and your heart shall rejoice & your joy no one shall take away from you." We looked into the Face of Mercy while making the stations of the cross & our Holy Face Devotion, Our Lord's face beaten and bloodied, His head crowned with thorns but soon—in a little while—we shall see his Glorious Face, the face of the Good Shepherd who loves us with an infinite love! Let us continue to be pleasing to Our Good Shepherd. Hear His voice and let Him hear yours. Stay close to Him so we will be ready when He comes!
